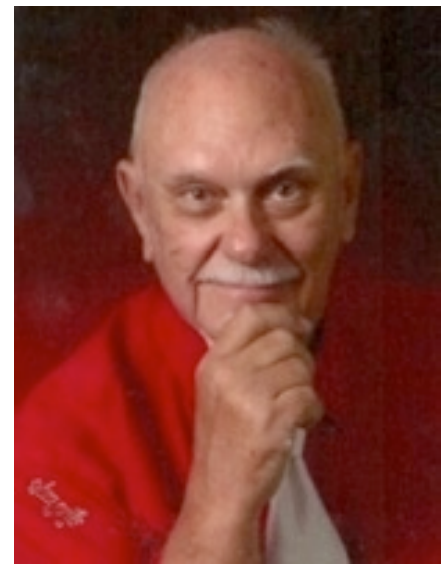

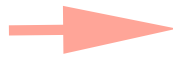

The ability to Cut and paste is one of the basic advantages of using a computer over a typewriter. (remember those?)

Pasting Directions for a scrapbook:

1. Cut out articles and pictures.
2. Paste them on pages in a booklet that you are making



Computer Directions:

1. Get ready with a document open
2. Next in another document Select the text (it should appear in a highlighted color). Press the command c keys. The command key is next to the spacebar. { C stands for COPY }
3. Go back to your document and Paste the Selected Text into it. Use command v to paste. { V stands for Paste since the computer uses P for print }
4. You may Edit the Selected Text or change it. (type new stuff in)



President Trump's [plan to raise military spending](#) for the coming fiscal year by \$54 billion, or nearly 10 percent, won't strengthen America's security, and might, in fact, undermine it. To pay for this unjustified increase, Mr. Trump reportedly [plans to cut](#) spending on other agencies, most notably the State Department and foreign aid, whose contribution to American security is at least as important as more armaments and troops.

Slashing support for diplomacy would leave the government with fewer tools to prevent conflict. For that very reason, former Defense Secretary Robert Gates argued vigorously for increases in the State Department budget and the foreign aid account. Jim Mattis, the new defense secretary, should do the same. Foreign aid amounts to about 1 percent of federal spending, or \$42.4 billion, much of it for American-made weaponry.

Computer Directions:

1. Get ready to send **me** an email and have the email document open

4. Edit the Selected Text with your info (type it in)
5. Mail it to me

1. notice the font, color and size may change when pasted into your email doc. As long as we can read it that's OK.
2. I put my info in **red** to show you; you don't need to.
3. Just select and type **over** my sample information with **your info**.

iPhone or iPad Directions:

1. Get ready to send me an email and have the email document open
then follow the above directions. The *a and *b indicate the differences between the computer and the device in cutting and pasting.

note: this is a bit more difficult on a device ...

On a device that is opened you can quickly flip from one open Application to another if you quickly press the **home key 2 times**.

*a. once text is **selected/highlighted*** then the option to copy should appear. **click on copy**.

*b. next, on your email document move your curser and select

*Selecting on a device is difficult for me as I must first move my finger over the text until a highlighted word appears, then move the tiny pointers to select the desired text, then pause until a box with the word copy appears and then click it.

*pasting on a device also requires you to first move a finger over the text until the text box with the word paste appears, then when selected the coping text appears. Editing the text just means moving your finger, or a stylus to the desired spot. Good luck!

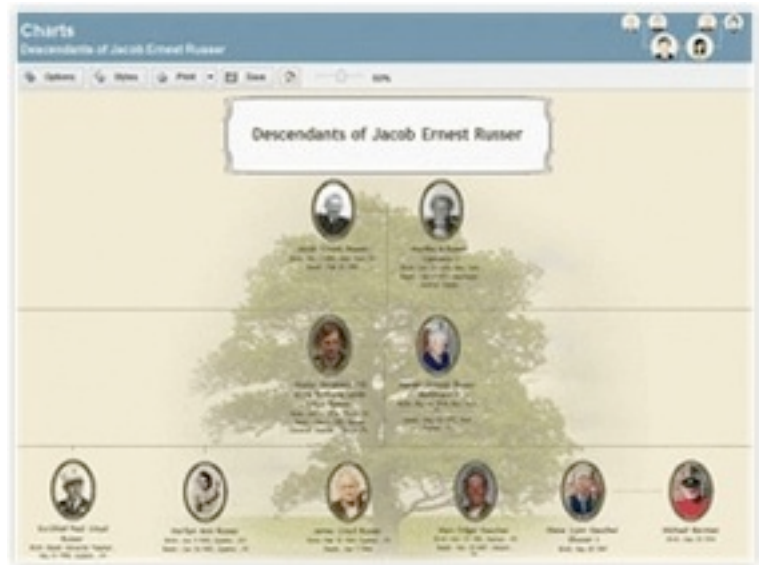

NEW BUSINESS:

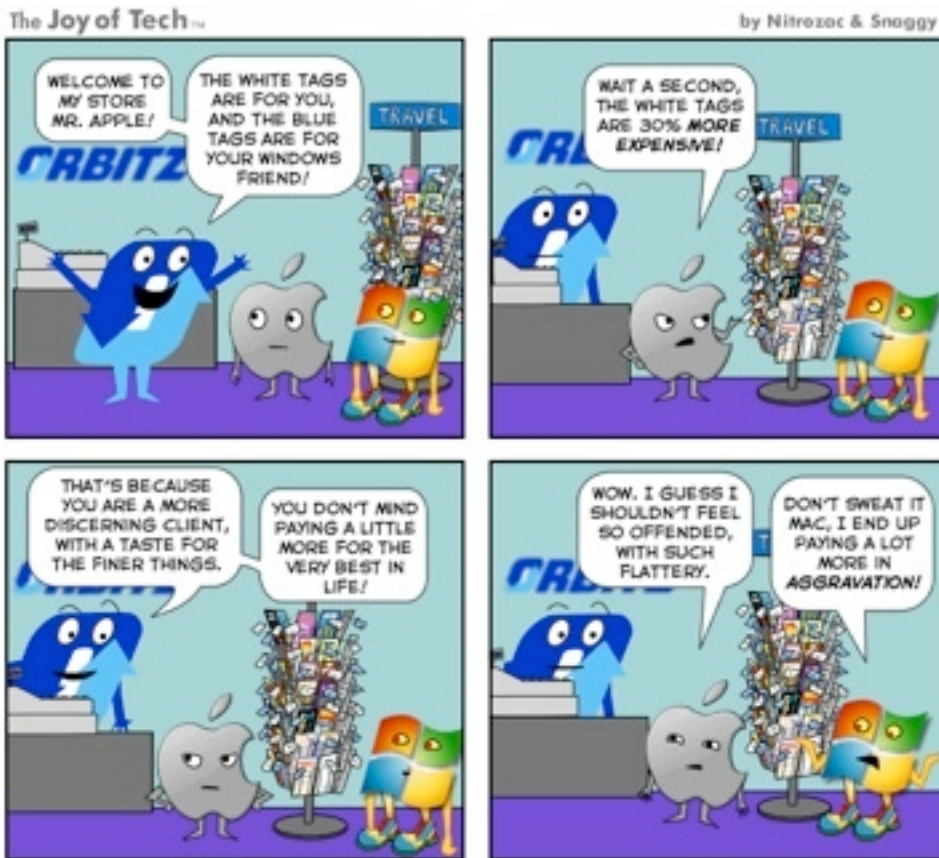
